WHAT'S UP with the NAA

Annual Members Meeting. The NAA's Annual Members Meeting was not held on October 13 due to lack of a quorum, so the Board met October 15 to review the status of the organization and elect the Board of Directors and its officers.

Executive Director Terry Foreman reported on programs and projects over the past year, and the minutes of the 2009 annual meeting were approved.

Elected by a unanimous vote of 11 members were officers Jeff Smith, President; Carol Boncelet, Vice President; and Niki Rose Chester, Treasurer; and Directors Roby Barnes, Nancy Breslin, Michele McCann, Melissa Marshall, Paul Schlosser, and Annie Smith. The Secretary's position is currently vacant.

Four members of our board who have resigned to address other obligations were recognized for their service: Kristina Goverts, Gordon Heatherston, Ray Magnani, and Karen Zalewski.

A key item of business was determining how to reduce the day-to-day operations

responsibilities for the Executive Director so that she can pursue grant funding, coordinate programming, and provide oversight of NAA activities. The organization is currently running at a deficit, so hours and pay for the existing two staff members cannot be increased.

The Board is seeking:

- a Volunteer Coordinator, to ensure that the NAA is regularly monitored, and helpers at events are arranged and prepared;
- an Office Assistant, to help with administrative duties;
- a Communications Director, to handle public relations, marketing, and press relations; and
- one or more Event Coordinators, to take charge of specific events.

NAA members: Get your work in the Gallery Shop! The opportunity to show and sell work in the Gallery Shop at the Newark Arts Alliance building is one of the benefits of NAA membership. All types of artwork are welcome: paintings, pottery, cards and postcards, jewelry, sculpture and much more. The committee is particularly interested in expanded the collection of music, literature (novels, poetry, chapbooks, cartoon anthologies, etc.), and films for sale in the shop.

Items can be dropped off at any time during regular hours. Submissions are juried by the Gallery Shop Committee on the first Monday of each month. Accepted work will be displayed for one to three months.

The jury criteria are: originality (no kits or copies); well-crafted, skillful execution; and professional presentation. All work must be for sale.

The commission to the NAA is 30% for non-working members and 20% for working members (at least four volunteer hours per month). All 2-D work must be framed with picture wire for hanging, or mounted, matted, and covered with acetate.

NAA Exhibition Gallery Guidelines. For juried shows, artists may submit up to three pieces. No reproductions are permitted when used only to duplicate work created in another medium (e.g., giclee prints of an original work), and work may not have been exhibited previously in either the Gallery Shop or the Exhibition Gallery.

The submission fee is \$5 per piece for NAA members, \$10 for others. This charge supports promotional and other costs associated with the exhibit. If the fee prohibits you from participating, please write to the Gallery Committee and request a waiver.

Please include label on each entry with your name, the title of the work, the medium (acrylic, raku, computer scan, etc.), your phone number and e-mail address, and a selling price, if applicable. (Work may be marked NFS.) All 2-D work must have a hanging wire on the back and must be framed in keeping with professional standards (no dirty mats, damaged glass, chipped frames, etc.).

Commission on sales to the NAA is 20% for working members (at least four volunteer hours per month), 30% for non-working members, and 40% for non-members.
