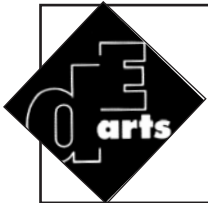

Pre-College Studio for student artists. Two new groups join Mosaic's Mad Hatters. Smith joins NAA Board. Jeff Smith, a long-time member of the NAA Advisory Committee and coordinator for the Gallery Shop Committee, has joined the Board of Directors.

A primarily self-taught photographer, he concentrates on candid photographs of people, intended not as portraits of the person or persons

pictured, but as vignettes illustrating our commonalities. Smith is the once and current president of the Delaware Photographic Society. He has served as chairman of the Wilmington International Exhibition of Photography four times.

He became seriously involved with photography about 30 years ago, when he received a 35-mm SLR as a Christmas gift. He soon learned that the cheapest way to use it constantly was with self-processed monochrome film. He still uses black-and-white more often than not, and much of his darkroom equipment was manufactured before he was born.

A graduate of Christiana High School and The University of Delaware, Smith has pursued (and been pursued by) many careers, including freelance photographer and writer, probation and parole officer, copywriter, newspaper special sections editor, longshoreman, babysitter, bookstore clerk, census enumerator, singer-songwriter, produce salesman, photography instructor, and as a replacement for a broken switch. In 2005, he served as a Crisis Corps Volunteer in Louisiana, following Hurricane Katrina.

He also joined the U.S. Peace Corps, going to the Philippines as an agricultural adviser. He acted as an agricultural extension agent to a group of remote villages and then became involved with a province-wide USAID project introducing new permanent crops.

He remained in the Philippines to help create a private corporation from the former project. His return to the U.S. was ultimately precipitated by a typhoon that flattened, but did not destroy, his business, and seriously damaged all of his possessions, including 17 years worth of negatives. He is currently working to recover some of these images with the help of digital imaging, which he otherwise generally avoids.

The opportunity to sell work in the Gallery Shop at the Newark Arts Alliance is one of the benefits of NAA membership. All types of artwork are welcome: paintings and prints, ceramics, jewelry and other "wearable art," music and poetry – and much more.

Artwork can be dropped off during regular NAA hours. The Gallery Shop Committee juries submissions during the fourth week of each month. Accepted work is displayed for one to three months.

The jury criteria are: originality (no kits or copies); well-crafted, skillful execution; and professional presentation. All 2-D work must be framed with picture wire for hanging, or mounted, matted, and covered with acetate. Unframed flat art should not exceed 24 inches in any dimension.

All work must be for sale. The commission to the NAA is 30% for non-working members and 20% for working members (at least four hours per month).

NAA Exhibition Gallery Guidelines

For juried shows, artists may submit up to three pieces. The submission fee is \$5 per artwork. This charge supports promotional and other costs associated with the exhibit. If the fee prohibits you from participating, please write to the Exhibition Gallery Committee and request a waiver.

Please include label on each entry with your name, the title of the work, the medium (acrylic, raku, computer scan, etc.), your phone number and e-mail address, and a selling price, if applicable. (Work may be marked NFS.) All 2-D work must have a hanging wire on the back and must be framed in keeping with professional standards (no dirty mats, damaged glass, chipped frames, etc.).

Commission on sales to the NAA is 20% for working members (at least four volunteer hours per month), 30% for non-working members, and 40% for non-members.
