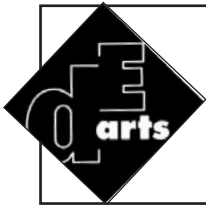

the Delaware College of Art and Design, the Delaware Center for the Contemporary Arts, and the Delaware Art Museum.

The intensive one-week program, open to students who have completed at least one year of high school, will include a drawing class; open studio times; portfolio reviews; and an elective class in art history, graphic design, illustration, painting, or photography. Students who complete the program may earn one DCAD academic credit.

The program runs the week of July 23, from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. each day. A residential option is available, with students checking into DCAD-operated housing on Sun., July 22. The program concludes Fri., July 27, with a student art exhibition and reception.

What's Up With the NAA

NAA site update

The Grainery Station, the NAA's current site, will be demolished to make way for a new building on that site that combines retail space and apartments. Newark City Council unanimously approved plans for the project, known as The Millyard, at its April 23 meeting.

The NAA's Board of Directors and staff are continuing to talk with the developer and look into other location options. We can exercise our lease at the Grainery Station, which has two years to run; we can vacate the Grainery Station, with plans to move back into the new structure to be built on the property; or we can try to find another location that meets our needs and budget.

She holds a BA from Rutgers University (NJ); an MD from the University of Pittsburgh (PA), and an MFA from The University of Delaware

The opportunity to sell work in the Gallery Shop at the Newark Arts Alliance is one of the benefits of NAA membership. All types of artwork are welcome: paintings and prints, ceramics, jewelry and other “wearable art,” music and poetry – and much more.

Artwork can be dropped off during regular NAA hours. The Gallery Shop Committee juries submissions during the fourth week of each month. Accepted work is displayed for one to three months.

The jury criteria are: originality (no kits or copies); well-crafted, skillful execution; and professional presentation. All 2-D work must be framed with picture wire for hanging, or mounted, matted, and covered with acetate. Unframed flat art should not exceed 24 inches in any dimension.

All work must be for sale. The commission to the NAA is 30% for non-working members and 20% for working members (at least four hours per month).

For juried shows, artists may submit up to three pieces. The submission fee is \$5 per artwork. This charge supports promotional and other costs associated with the exhibit. If the fee prohibits you from participating, please write to the Exhibition Gallery Committee and request a waiver.

Please include label on each entry with your name, the title of the work, the medium (acrylic, raku, computer scan, etc.), your phone number and e-mail address, and a selling price, if applicable. (Work may be marked NFS.) All 2-D work must have a hanging wire on the back and must be framed in keeping with professional standards (no dirty mats, damaged glass, chipped frames, etc.).

Commission on sales to the NAA is 20% for working members (at least four volunteer hours per month), 30% for non-working members, and 40% for non-members.
