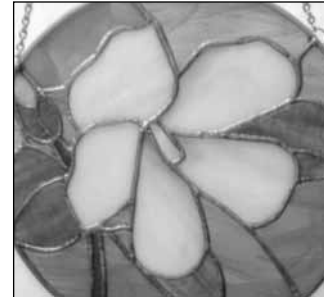

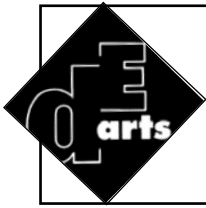

University of Delaware exhibits. "Visionary Anatomies" showcases work by 11 contemporary artists who, inspired by medical science, incorporate modern medical imaging into their work. The exhibit, provided by the National Academy of Sciences and the Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibition Service, runs through Dec. 10 at the University Gallery at Old College, Main Street and North College Avenue.

"One on One: Image and Response" features more than 30 selections from the University's Paul R. Jones Collection of African-American Art, accompanied by the responses of 20 writers who have recorded their personal reactions to specific works. NAA Exhibition Gallery Guidelines

For juried shows, artists may submit up to three pieces. The submission fee is \$5 per artwork. This charge supports promotional and other costs associated with the exhibit. If the fee prohibits you from participating, please write to the Exhibition Gallery Committee and request a waiver.

Please include label on each entry with your name, the title of the work, the medium (acrylic, raku, computer scan, etc.), your phone number and e-mail address, and a selling price, if applicable. (Work may be marked NFS.) All 2-D work must have a hanging wire on the back and must be framed in keeping with professional standards (no dirty mats, damaged glass, chipped frames, etc.).

Commission on sales to the NAA is 20% for working members (at least four volunteer hours per month), 30% for non-working members, and 40% for non-members.

NAA members: Get your work in the Gallery Shop!

The opportunity to show and sell work in the Gallery Shop at the Newark Arts Alliance is one of the benefits of NAA membership.

All types of artwork are welcome: paintings, pottery, cards and postcards, jewelry, sculpture – and much more. The committee is particularly interested in expanding the collection of music, literature (novels, poetry, chapbooks, cartoon anthologies, etc.), and films for sale in the shop.

Items can be dropped off at any time during regular hours. Submissions are juried by the Gallery Shop Committee during the fourth week of each month. Accepted work will be displayed for one to three months.

The jury criteria are: originality (no kits or copies); well-crafted, skillful execution; and professional presentation. All 2-D work must be framed with picture wire for hanging, or mounted, matted, and covered with acetate.

All work must be for sale. The commission to the NAA is 30% for non-working members and 20% for working members (at least four hours per month).

Directors approved at annual meeting

The NAA Board of Directors for 2006-07 was approved at the annual meeting on Oct. 4. Elected as officers were: **Ray Magnani**, President; **Paul Schlosser**, Treasurer; and **Barbara French**, Secretary/Advocate. Also serving on the Board are **Michele McCann**, **Carol Boncelet**, **Melissa Cox**, **Laura Way**, **Gordon Hetherston**, and NAA staff members **Susan Logan**, Administrative Director, and **Terry Foreman**, Program Director.

Logan presented a summary of events and achievements for the past year, including community events, projects, Exhibition Gallery, Gallery Shop, ongoing and special events, education programs, Camp Imagine, communications, outreach, the NAA Advisory Committee, classes and workshops, and the three internships.

Membership recruitment strategies were also discussed.

At the October Board meeting following the annual meeting, the Directors considered a proposal from the owner of the Grainery Shops, where the NAA is located. He is having drawings created to construct a new building at the other end of the parking lot. The existing building would then be torn down. If the NAA is interested in being a tenant in the new structure, the Board would need to meet with him to discuss needs and costs.

Other business included:

- proposals for three shows for the coming year – a juried show on the national level, an animal-themed show, and a themed show in connection with the 250th anniversary of the City of Newark, which begins in 2007;
- three pending applications for grants;
- a volunteer appreciation event;
- membership recruitment strategies, and
- the budget.

Artists must be connected with the state of Delaware – through residency, studio space, frequent exhibition, involvement with an arts organization, or enrollment in a Delaware school – to enter work for the show. Entrants should submit three to six slides or a CD with jpeg files of work created within the past three years.

The juror is Jacqueline Cornette, a professional exhibiting fine artist and former creative/art director in advertising.
