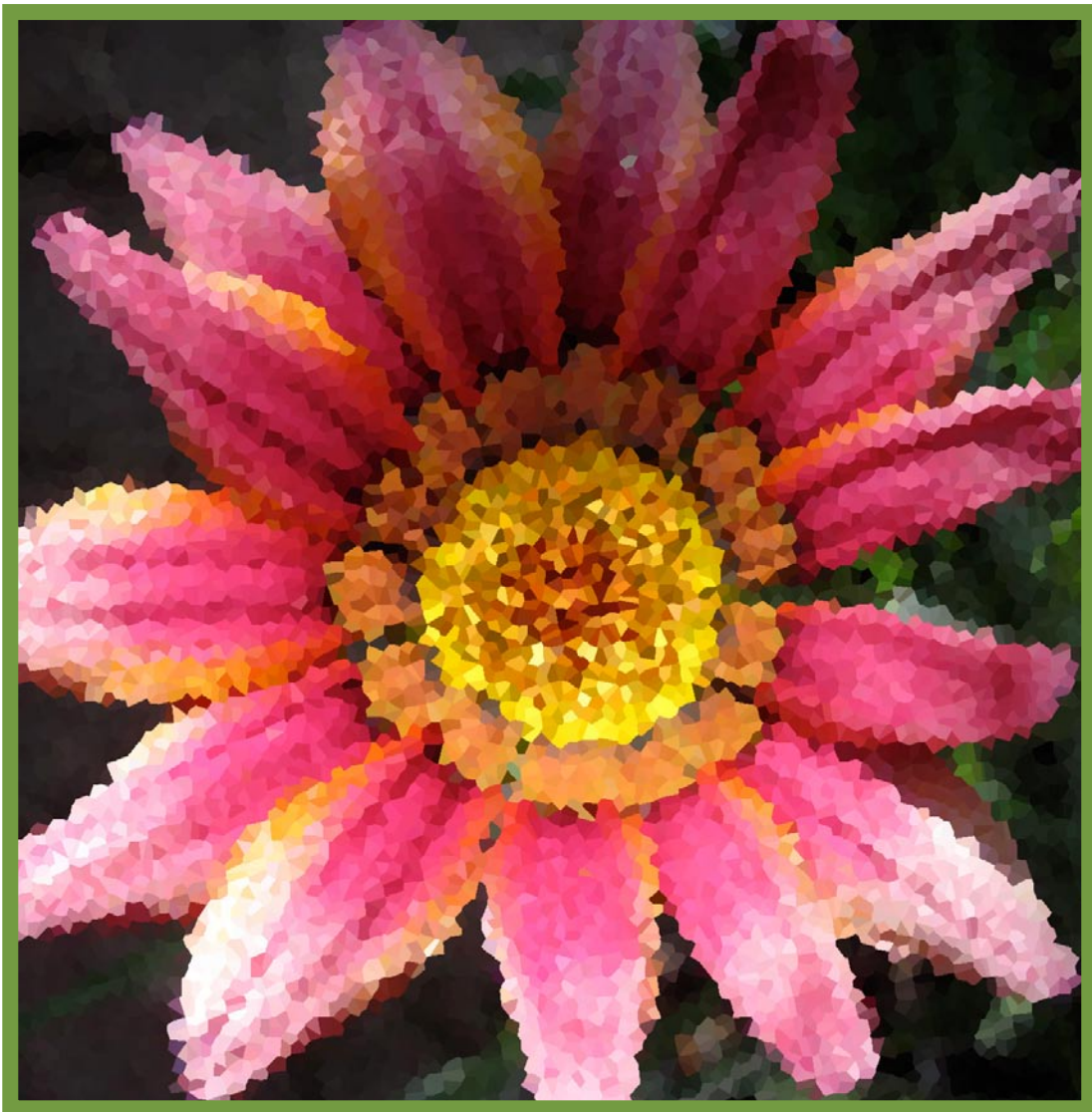

Adult/Teen Classes

Bellydancing Workshop/101 REVISED DESCRIPTION!

June 10, 1 Thursday, 6:30-8:30pm

Bellydancing Workshop/102

August 12, 1 Thursday, 6:30-8:30pm

Taught by Maya & Ilianna. Age 14 to Adult. Explore the exciting world of Middle Eastern dance in 2 separate workshops. You will be taught a basic introduction to the art form. Students will learn basic belly dance moves and combinations, which will be used to form a choreography. These are 2 separate 1 day workshops. A separate choreography will be taught for each workshop, which can be used together. Take 1 or both workshops. \$16M/\$18NM for each workshop.

Art Career Workshop and The Art of Presentation/103

June 13, Sunday, 12-3pm

Taught by Chad Cortez Everett. Ages 16 to Adult. You love to create, but how do you get your work out of your studio and on display? Learn all the steps needed to tell your story and present your work to artist venues and the art buying public. Class covers the artists resume and cover letter, framing and matting artwork, how to approach a gallery, creating a promotional package and how to market your work to the public. Students should bring samples of their artwork, resume (if they have one), matt board and old or new frames. \$24M/\$26NM

Mosaics From Start to Finish/104

July 6 to 27, 4 Tuesdays 6:30-8:30

Taught by Carole Fox. Ages 14 to adult. You can make your own mosaic pieces from clay in the first class and glaze them in the next. In the third class, apply your handmade tiles to a wooden mirror frame that you will grout and take home on the last day. Students who have completed this class will be invited to volunteer their time in a continuation of the outdoor mosaic on the NAA building this fall. (not required) \$89M/\$97NM

Digital Camera Boot Camp/BASIC/105

July 7, Wednesday, 7-9pm

Taught by Dain Simons. Ages 14 & up. Limited to 6 students. You've got one of those clever digital cameras but do you really know how to use it? Camera manuals and live instruction are two different things. Learn the basics of the basic settings, taking a shot, saving files and transferring your images to CD's or getting prints. This is a basic level class for those unfamiliar with their cameras. \$30members/\$33non-members.

Ways with Watercolor/111 NEW CLASS ADDED!

July 8-Aug. 26, 6 Thursdays, 6:00-8:00pm.

Taught by Dawn Majewski. Ages 16 to Adult. Explore and celebrate the sometimes unpredictable directions in which watercolor painting takes us. Make color wheels and transparency charts. Mix colors from a limited palette, find out how to use the characteristic strengths of different pigments, try some techniques to enliven your paintings, and learn from "mistakes." Drawing Your World/106

July 12-26, 7-8:30pm, 3 Mondays

Taught by Terry Foreman. Ages 16 to adult. We'll learn basic drawing concepts including line weight, shading, foreground and background and drawing what we see, not what we think we see. We'll use these skills to create drawings of everyday objects as well as surreal compositions. \$48M/\$52NM Includes sketchbook and drawing kit.

Digital Camera Boot Camp/INTERMEDIATE/107

July 14, Wednesday, 7-9pm

Taught by Dain Simons. Ages 14 & up. Limited to 6 students. This class is for those who've been using their digital cameras but may not know all the options. Let a pro show you how to navigate the controls and understand what your camera can really do to create great shots. Students should be familiar with the basic controls of their cameras and have taken pictures before taking this class. \$30members/\$33non-members.

Collage Friday Night Art Date/108

July 16, 6-8:30pm, Friday

Taught by Terry Foreman. Ages 18 to adult. This is a grown up version of our kids' art date. We'll make mini-collages on canvas using papers, magazine images, clip art, stamps and other found objects. Bring your own goodies to work with or use ours. This is an invigorating art form for anyone willing to let go and create something. You'll make 2-3 small collages. We'll offer pizza and soft drinks and some wine for those who want it. Bring a friend and enjoy an evening of art and arty company. \$32M/\$34NM

Paper and Silk Marbling/109

July 24, Saturday 1-5pm (one day workshop)

Taught by Richard Aldorasi. Ages 14 to Adult. Make marbled silk scarves and papers to give as gifts or keep for yourself! Marbling is the art of creating floating pitchers of color on top of a special water bath. After selecting and applying paint from 22 different color choices, swirling patterns of color are created using special tools known as rakes and combs. On the surface of these intricate swirling patterns, we apply the elegant method of figuring; thus producing fascinating floral effects that have for centuries, captured our hearts and minds with this Ottoman/ Islamic art technique. The workshop fee entitles you to make (2) 15x45 scarves and (2) 20 x 24 inch marbled papers. Additional scarves are \$10 ea. for 15x45 and \$20 ea. for 15 x72 and \$5 per piece of paper. Each participant can print several of their own silk scarves along with matching marbling paper prints that can be used to create cards, wrapping paper, gift boxes, etc. \$55 members/\$60 non-members

Papermaking Workshop, Go Green Now!/110

August 21, Saturday, 1-5pm (one day workshop)

Taught by Richard Aldorasi. Ages 14 to Adult. We will learn about the 2,000-year-old craft of papermaking while using recycled fibers for the "go green" approach. In this course, students form sheets of linen and cotton rag paper using authentic handmade laid wire moulds. They'll achieve extraordinary effects with a wide range of natural materials, luster pigments and embossed designs using contemporary papermaking techniques. Richard introduces the environmental issues of the 21st century and describes the important part Philadelphia played in being the first place paper was made in America. At the end of the workshop, students take home many sheets of handmade paper to use for unlimited craft ideas. \$42 members/\$46 non-members

The Color of Water: Mixing Art and Science/204
July 7 & 14, 2 Wednesdays, 9am-3pm
Taught by Vivian Williams, on behalf of Stroud Water Research. Ages 9-12. Students will travel to the property of artist Jamie Wyeth (border of PA and DE) and explore the beach along the Brandywine River. They will search for life, make identifications and sketch/paint observations in pen, pencil and watercolor use wet and dry brush techniques. They will be given a tour of Wyeth's on-site gallery and see farm animals on the property. The following week students will work at the NAA and will use their beachcombing treasures from the previous week to create growth pattern shell designs using markers and oil pastels. "Where the Wild Things Are" Soft Sculpture Workshop/206
July 10-17, 1-3pm, 2 Saturdays
Taught by Terry Foreman. Ages 10 to Adult. Join the craze and make your own, soft, stuffed monsters, thingsys, animals or people. We'll draft patterns from our own crazy drawings and pick from a variety of felts, furs and printed fleeces to hand sew our buddy together. We'll embellish with buttons, yarn, sequins, beads and markers, then stuff it. Basic hand sewing skills helpful but not necessary. This is a great class to take with a friend or a parent/child combo. Drum Rhythms for Everyone/207
July 10, Saturday, 2-3:30pm (one day workshop)
Taught by Rebecca Sullivan. Ages 8-12. Learn to recognize and play basic Middle Eastern rhythms. The class will teach basic rhythms such as Baladi, Chifitelli and Malfuf, which can be, used in drum circles as well as at Middle Eastern belly dance events. Students will practice with drums and other instruments, as well as clapping. We will also listen to some recorded music and pick out the rhythm used. Bring any percussion instrument, or a melody instrument you know well. No previous music training is needed. There will be printed information and some drums to borrow. \$12M/\$14NM
